



Baby Blankies

38" x 38" Receiving Blanket

Baby can't have enough blankies and these are the perfect ones! "Sew" easy to make you'll have several finished in one day. Wrap them up with pretty paper and they make the perfect shower gift or welcome home gift for that new baby. Embellish with a little trim and your blankies will look better than store bought. Have fun sewing!

MATERIALS NEEDED:

- 1 ¼ yard fabric or flannel for blanket front
- Or...64 squares 5 ½" x 5 ½"
- 1 ¼ yard flannel for blanket back
- 4 ½ yards lace trim or rick rack

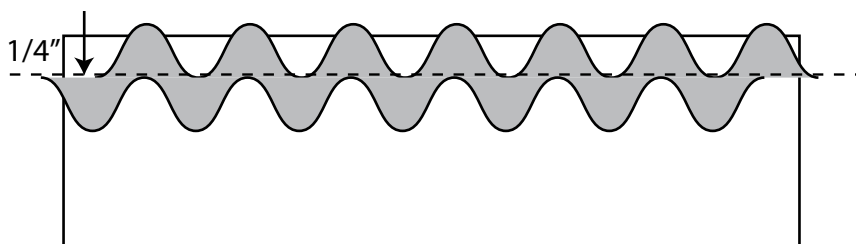
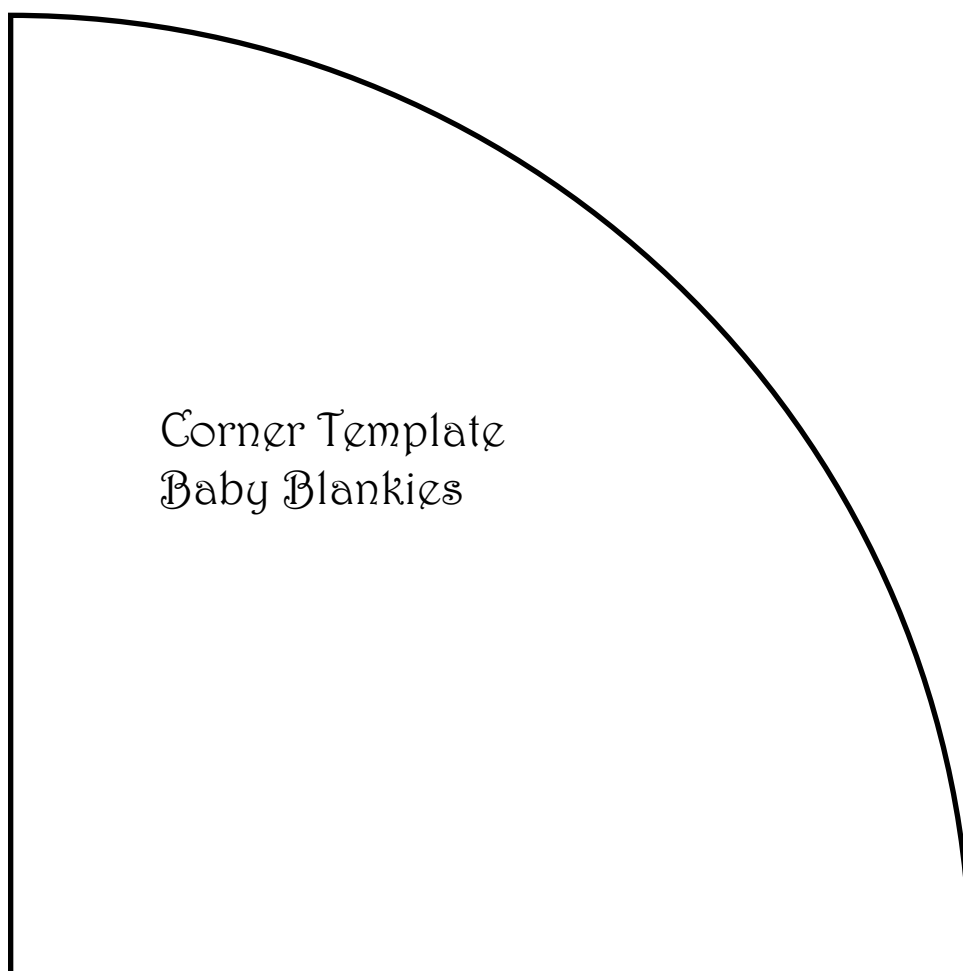
CUTTING & SEWING INSTRUCTIONS:

****ALL SEAMS ARE ¼"*****

1. Cut blanket front and blanket back 38 ½" x 38 ½".
**see below if using pre-cut squares
2. Using the paper pattern provided, make a template for the rounded corner. (*template on back*)
3. Using the template made in step 1, trim all four corners of the blanket front and back even with the curve of the template.
4. Position the rick rack or lace on top of the blanket front so that the center of the rick rack strip falls ¼" in from the quilt's outer edge. The edge of the rick rack should extend just slightly beyond the quilt's raw edge. If using lace place the edge of the lace even with the edge of the blanket front. Turn under ends of rick rack where it joins together. (*diagram on back*)
5. With right sides together sew blanket front to blanket back catching in lace or rick rack as you sew. Leave an 8" opening on bottom for turning.
6. Turn right sides out, press and slip stitch opening closed.
7. Top stitch around entire blanket, ¼" from edge.

****If you are using pre-cut squares for the blanket front, sew 8 rows of squares together, pressing each row in the opposite direction. Proceed following directions above.**
